Credits and Cancellations:

1. If we have to buy tickets in advance for a trip there will be no refund for cancellation unless there is a waiting list and someone can take your place.
2. We must have your cancellation notice 48 hours (two days) prior to the trip or event or you will not receive a refund or credit. (Ask about overnight trip cancellation policy.)
3. If you have cancelled an event or trip you can request a credit or refund. Your credit will be on file in the office. The next time you sign up for a trip, make sure your credit is pulled and attached to your reservation form. You can request a refund if your trip, event, or accumulated credits are greater than \$30. Refunds will be mailed within 30 days.

Election of Officers Rambler Board 2019-2020

The Roswell Ramblers will elect a President, Vice President, Recording Secretary and a Treasurer at the General Membership Meeting/Luncheon on June 13th. The ballot shall contain the names of those members recommended by the Nominating Committee and any nominations offered from the floor at the May General Membership Meeting on May 9th.

Voting Guidelines

- Only qualified members may vote. A qualified member is one who has paid dues and attended at least two meetings in the preceding 12 months.
- Qualified members may vote by absentee ballot. Absentee ballots shall be available after the May meeting. Requests for an absentee ballot must be in writing.
- Absentee ballots shall be numbered and must be received in a sealed envelope by the ARC no later than the day before the June Meeting.
- Any person who receives an absentee ballot shall not be allowed to vote in person or by proxy at the June Meeting.
- A qualified member may give his/her voting rights to another qualified member by use of a proxy vote form. Proxies must be in writing, signed and dated by the member giving the proxy and must be documented by the Recording Secretary prior to the June Meeting being called to order.
- Proxies may only be used for ballot voting and may not be used for verbal voting.

Bocce is played around Europe and also in overseas areas including Australia and South America. Bocce has slowly become popular at the Roswell Adult Recreation Center and Fulton County. It is part of the Golden Games played yearly. There is a bocce open play where everyone is welcome to come and play a game or two. Open play is every Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from 8-11:00 a.m. Weather permitting. All are welcome. Current players will gladly instruct new players on how to play the game. Other groups of people can reserve the courts by calling the Roswell Adult Recreation Center at 770-641-3950. Currently people with disabilities, the Roswell Petanque Club and a group from a Senior Living facility use the courts.

Rambler Riders

All Skill Levels Welcome, FREE!

Rambler Riders is an informal cycling group for beginners and also for more experienced riders with rides scheduled once a month. Membership in Roswell Ramblers is required to participate. All rides will be on fairly level, dedicated bike paths. Cycling helmet is required. Rides are free of charge, however, riders must sign up for each ride via the event form available at the Adult Recreation Center front desk. Participants must provide an email address or phone number so they can be contacted if there are changes to the itinerary. Please check your Roswell Rambler newsletter or the event sign up forms for ride dates, times and locations. Note that times are "ready to ride" - therefore, you should plan to be at the meeting site at least 15 minutes before the ride to prepare (take your bike off the rack, put your helmet on, use the restroom, etc.).

Rambler Easy Riders: For beginning cyclists, these rides will be conducted at an easy pace, traveling 5-6 miles. Basic cycling instructions will be provided for best riding experience. Rides are typically scheduled on the 3rd Thursday of the month April through October unless noted.

Rambler Ready Riders: For more experienced cyclists, these rides travel at a moderate pace of 10-12 mph, traveling 12-16 miles. Rides are typically scheduled on the 3rd Sunday of the month April through October unless noted.
