Honoring Our Heritage

The first group of seniors to assemble for fun and fellowship were the Golden Endeavors and the Roswell Pacesetters in 1997. They met at the River Landing Club House on Azalea Drive. The first newsletter was called the SENIOR NEWS and was published quarterly. Membership dues were \$5.00 and year and business meetings were held on the 2nd Wed. of the month beginning at 2:00 followed by coffee, dessert and a special guest. Our Mary was the editor of the newsletter and the supervisor of the club which was a part of the Recreation and Parks Dept.

In 2000 the ARC building was completed and the group moved here. In 2002 the Rambler Club was officially organized. The members got together and suggested names for the club and then voted to name it. A member, Mildred Childress, proclaimed "We ramble around all the time so we should be called the Ramblers." According to legend, it stuck! A song was written to the tune Side By Side and was presented at the GPRA Talent Show. The club has been recognized and given awards for many innovative programs that are offered. Groups have won many prizes in State talent shows.

Today we have around 800 members who are involved in many activities from Art to Zumba. We have had and still have many musical and theater groups such as the Kazoo Band and the More or Less Players Drama Club. Many members volunteered their time to teach arts and crafts groups and line dancing to name a few. We have raised much money through the Bus Bucks Project to purchase our big bus and small bus. We raised money to support the fitness room and the Aquatic Center.

Bocce is played around Europe and also in overseas areas including Australia, North America, and South America. Bocce has slowly become popular at the Adult Recreation Center and in Fulton County. It is a part of the Golden Games played yearly. There is a bocce open play where everyone is welcome to come and play a game or two.

Weather permitting. All are welcome. Current players will gladly instruct new players on how to play the game. Currently Therapeutic Recreation, Roswell Pentaque Club and a group from a Senior Living facility use the courts. Roswell Ramblers Mission Statement:

The mission of the Roswell Ramblers Club is to engage, enrich and empower active adults ages fifty and above in our community through health and wellness activities, lifelong learning, recreation, arts, travel and community service.

Credits and Cancellations:

1. If we have to buy tickets in advance for a trip there will be no refund for cancellation unless there is a waiting list and someone can take your place.
2. We must have your cancellation notice 48 hours (two days) prior to the trip or event or you will not receive a refund or credit. (Ask the front office about overnight trip cancellation policy.)
3. If you have cancelled an event or trip you can request a credit or refund. Your credit will be on file in the office. The next time you sign up for a trip, make sure your credit is pulled and attached to your reservation form. You can request a refund if your trip, event, or accumulated credits are greater than \$30. Refunds will be mailed within 30 days.

Code of Conduct:

Emphasis is placed on creating a positive, rewarding environment for all members of the Roswell Rambler's Club.

- Members shall treat other members and staff with courtesy and respect.

- Members shall not use profanity or engage in derogatory comments or language that is abusive, insulting or threatening.
- Members shall take care of any space used such as the break room, kitchen, billiards room etc. and clean up after themselves.

Consequences for failure to observe this code are:

1. A verbal warning from a member of the Ramblers Executive Board will be issued and recorded.
2. If the behavior continues, a written warning from the Ramblers Executive Board will be issued and recorded.
3. If two written warnings are issued, the member could be suspended from membership.

The following rules must be followed at the Adult Recreation Center:

- No smoking or alcohol is permitted on the property.
- Offensive language, physical or verbal attacks on another member, volunteer or staff member is not permitted
- The building structure, furnishings, and fixtures shall be treated with respect.

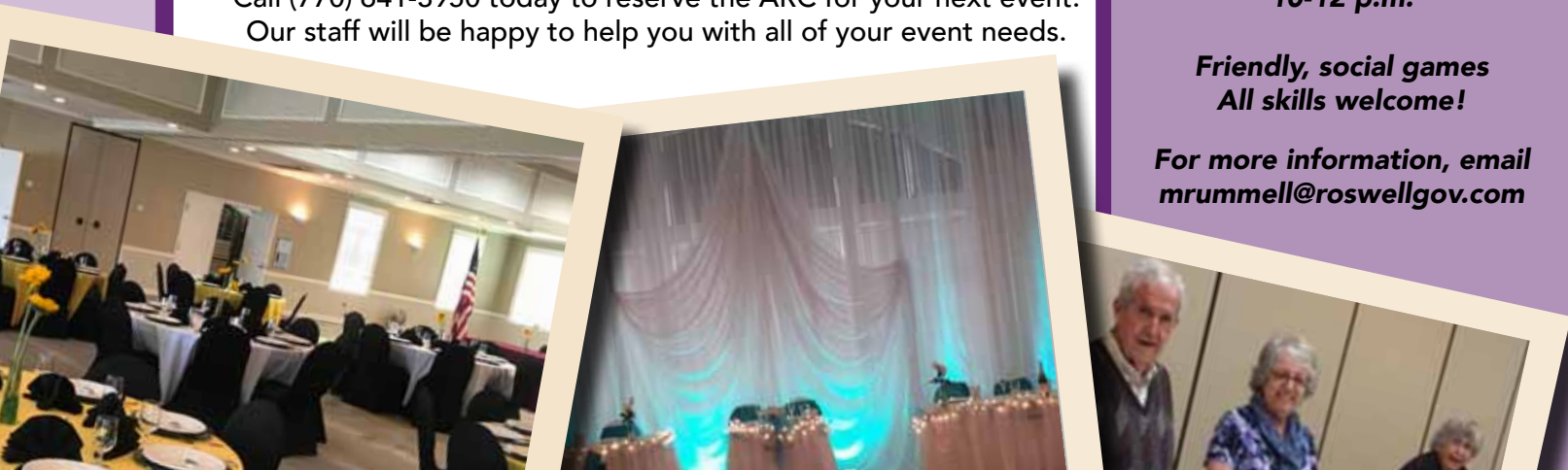

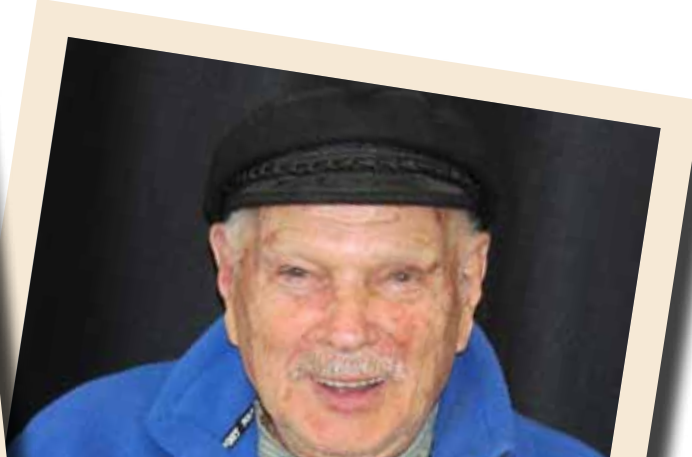
